



Informed Consent for Administration of Contrast Material

Your doctor has referred you to us for an imaging procedure that may involve a contrast injection. Allergy to the contrast is infrequent and usually causes minimal reactions, if any. In rare cases, some patients may experience, nausea, hives, rash, itching, shortness of breath, NSF (nephrogenic systemic fibrosis) or an anaphylactic reaction. There is a Radiologist on site for all contrast procedures. Please remember that the risk of a problematic reaction is small and your referring physician believes that the benefit outweighs the risk of a potential reaction. The likelihood of a reaction is considered to be low. Please ask yourself the questions below. If the answer is yes to any of the questions, it is important that you inform all of your treating medical providers that you have had a contrast injection.

- Are you pregnant or breast feeding? Yes No
